English REPLACING THE BATTERIES

Your TMJR150 functions using 1 x CR2032 lithium battery. Only the specified batteries must be used.

Do not use rechargeable batteries. Do not mix various types of batteries or old and new batteries. The batteries must be installed with the correct polarity. Old batteries must be removed from the product The terminals of a battery should not be short-circuited. Do not put batteries in to fire. Remove batteries if product is not going to be used for some time. Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.

If you want to replace batteries or if your apparatus presents an abnormal operation, removes the batteries from the compartment and follow the directions:

- 1) Turn off your product and open the battery compartment.
- 2) Replace with new battery.
- 3) Replace the battery cover.
- 4) Replace the battery in less than 1 minute to keep your data intact.

The machine will automatically switch off after 7 minutes of non-use.

TEMPERATURE OF EXPOSURE: 0°C with 40°C (32°F with 104°F), MEMORY SIZE: Press on "MEUN" " ", to visualize the remaining capacity.

RESET

Before using your organiser for the first time, press the RESET BUTTON located on the back of the product using a fine point.

"RESET?" is displayed with the screen. Press "ENTER" to confirm. This operation can take several seconds.

NUMBER KEY

2 keyboards are available: letters and numbers. Use the 2nd key to toggle between the different keyboard layouts.

CAPITALS AND LOWER CASE

Press "CAP" to change alphabet in capitals or lower case letters.

SOUNDS

Press " " key to turn the beep sound on or off.

LANGUAGE PREFERENCES

- 1) Press the "MENU" button located on the numeric keyboard.
- 2) Use the " A " and " Y " buttons to select the "Language" option.
- 3) Press " ENTER ".
- 4) Use " A " and " Y " to select the desired language.
- 5) Press " ENTER " to confirm.

SCROLLING FUNCTION MESSAGE

To set and scroll message in time mode, follow these steps:

- 1) Press "QPZMG" continuously in home time mode.
- 2) Input message on the first line (36 characters or numbers max.) then press "ENTER". The message is now set.
- 3) Press "Power" twice, the message begins scrolling automatically.
- 4) Press any key to stop scrolling and the screen returns to home time display.

Once message has been set, it will begin scrolling automatically every time you press " Power" to activate the organiser. If no key is pressed, the message will keep scrolling until the organiser auto-powers off.

If you want to change the message, just repeat all procedures above, then the new message will overwrite the old.
