




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Inserting the batteries

The unit requires two 1.5 volt batteries or two 1.2 volt NiMh batteries (see "Miscellaneous", page 35) with the highest capacity possible (MICRO LR03 AAA). Open the battery compartment as indicated in the diagram . When inserting the batteries, ensure that the poles are facing in the right direction (+, -).



Data is preserved by a 3-volt button cell (CR 12 20) when the batteries are being changed 2.

To replace the button cell, open the compartment as indicated in the diagram. When inserting the cell, ensure that the poles are facing in the right direction.

Press the Reset key 3 by inserting a thin pointed object (ballpoint pen) into the small opening. Three options appear on the screen (reset to default values):

- · Reset, but do not delete any data
- · Reset and delete all data
- · Reset, delete all data and all applications loaded


Getting started

Inserting the cards

The unit can accept two MMCards (MultiMediaCard $^{\text{TM}}$) and one chip card (smart card). The MMCards extend the unit's memory with capacities starting with 4 MB.

As indicated in the diagram ①, insert the MMCard into one of the slots provided on the front of the unit until it clicks into place. The first MMCard inserted is always referred to as MMCard 1, irrespective of whether it is inserted in the left or right slot.

To remove the card, press the small rectangular button to the left or right of the slot until the card is ejected.



The chip card **2** is inserted in the base of the unit until it clicks into place. The gold contact must face upwards.

Other elements

Setting the contrast/PC interface/telephone interface

On the left of the unit there is

- a thumbwheel 1 for adjusting the contrast of the screen
- the port 2 for PC and telephone connection
- (1) and 2 may be concealed by a slider).

Infrared (IrDA)

The infrared window 3 is situated on the right-hand side of the unit. For Ir-DA (infrared) transmission, the relevant units should be between 5 cm and 35 cm apart.

Lock

The screen lock 4 is centred on the front of the unit. To open, press the lock and raise the cover.



Ticker line

The ticker line under the screen can show the contents of unread short messages (SMS) or other information.

If the length of a short message exceeds the ticker line, the screen will scroll from right to left in order to display all the contents.

Important inputs

Before using IC35 for the first time, you should first set the time and date (see page 26) and enter your personal address information (business card):

You can press the cursor keys to search the list in alphabetical order for a particular address entry.

Using the search box

The search box is located below the list. You can enter the initial letters of the word here for a direct search.

The cursor bar scrolls through the list as you are making your entry. The input is ignored if there is no match for your entry.

Searching by keyword

You can find any information in an address entry by entering a keyword



Pull down the File menu.

Enter a keyword or part of a search string in the search box.



Confirm to search. A list containing the matches appears.



Use keys to move the cursor to the entry you want in the case of multiple matches.



The address entry is displayed.

Uploading the phonebook



Pull down the Tools menu and select Upload phonebook. Address information is copied to the telephone.

Copying from the Red Phonebook



Pull down the Tools menu and select Copy from the Red Phonebook.

Create a new folder for the entries (see "Telefonbuch herunterladen").



The phonebook is loaded.

Copying to the Red Phonebook

Select the address(es) you want.

Copying from and to SIM cards

By placing a large smart card in the IC35 card slot (see page 6), you can copy address information from the Address Book to the card (and vice versa).

1. Insert a smart card.

The phonebook is transferred.

- Identical address records will be overwritten during loading and copying.
- When writing to a smart card, address records with three phone numbers will split into three records with the same name.
- A prompt message SIM full appears during the writing process if there is no free SIM memory.

If you have entered birthdays in the Address Book, you can output these in a separate list.

The list of birthdays and corresponding ages is displayed.





- For IrDA (infrared) transmission, the relevant units should be between 5 cm and 35 cm apart. The IrDA windows must face each other and be within line of sight.
- E-mails of up to 4 kbyte are received (4096 characters), No attachments can be sent.

Creating a new message

You can create messages for the three SMS and e-mail communication types. You can access the "Address Book" for an address for this message and the "Note Pad" for text creation.



Pull down the File menu, select New followed by SMS or E-Mail.

Depending on your selection:

SMS Enter the phone number of the recipient.

E-Mail

Enter the e-mail address of the recipient and the reference.

Recipient selection from address list:

(MENU)

Pull down the File menu and select Tools.

Supplement the input fields:

You can add **Cc** and **Bcc** fields with **Setup E-Mail** (see page 22).

You can then compose the message text. In the case of SMS messages, you can access your autotexts (see also page 20).



Destination

You can set a second city, e.g. a travel destination. Proceed as for Local Setup.

Large clock

The map of the world can be replaced by a large clock screen.

To change, proceed as usual, this time selecting World Clock.

The calculator can perform standard 12-digit arithmetic operations such as addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, as well as percentage, square root and memory calculations.

Display

The calculator keeps track of operations as it works. The value of each operation is shown in bold face and they are separated by a dotted line.



Scroll through the display.

Calculator menu

You can also use the menu commands to enter operators, perform memory calculations and delete results.

Select Converter

(also possible: (FN) + (8)

You can make conversions between the Euro, 11 fixed European currencies and three user-defined currencies. The converter palette has two unit labels on the left of the screen for currencies in use and two display panels on the right for their values.

The selected input box appears as a linear display in which you can enter a value to be converted.

Setting the currency unit

Select one of the two currency boxes on the left.

(ins) Scroll to the currency required.

> Use the numeric keys to enter the amount. It is automatically converted into the target currency.

Corrections

Changing from one currency box to another sets the inputs to zero.

Deletes the input.

Open the menu and select MENU CE to delete the input.

Changing the rate/ currency



Open the menu and select Define Rate



Select one of the three unassigned positions.

Enter the rate and enter the currency name.



Concludes the setting. The currency name appears in the display field currently selected.

Viewing the exchange rate list

You can browse through the exchange rates for the fixed European currencies, the Euro and the userdefined currency units from a menu list.

All currencies are based on the EURO and. therefore, do not require adjustment in response to exchange rate fluctuations.

If the file/folder to be opened is a backup (see also page 29), IC35 asks you if you want to open the recovery version.

You can create a new folder and give it a name (max. 8 characters). On an MMCard the folder's name can also feature a 3-character suffix (e.g. INFO.TXT).

Rename

You can assign a new name to the currently selected folder. Exception: system-specific folders cannot be renamed.

Format MMCard

The multimedia card selected is formatted. A note appears.

Confirm with Yes to start the formatting.



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IC35 Sync software

The IC35 Sync software is a desktop program for the user-friendly synchronisation of your IC35 data with MS Outlook and Lotus Organizer. This software ensures that the same up-to-date data is always available on both your IC35 and your PC applications.

Operation is very easy. All it takes is a mouse click to import, export and synchronise data.

Software installation

The installation software can be found on the CD-ROM supplied. To install the IC35 Sync software, double-click the file:

Then follow the instructions issued by the installation program.

Connection between PC and IC35 via SyncStation


Connecting SyncStation to PC

Connect the SyncStation cable at the PC to a COM port (COM 1 to COM 4).

Make sure that the station is placed on a non-slip surface.

Connection between IC35 and SyncStation

Slide back the panel in front of the port on IC35 before plugging in the cable. Insert the IC35 in SyncStation



Initialise SyncStation by pressing the button on the front of the SyncStation. A green LED lights up on the IC35 when initialisation is successful.


